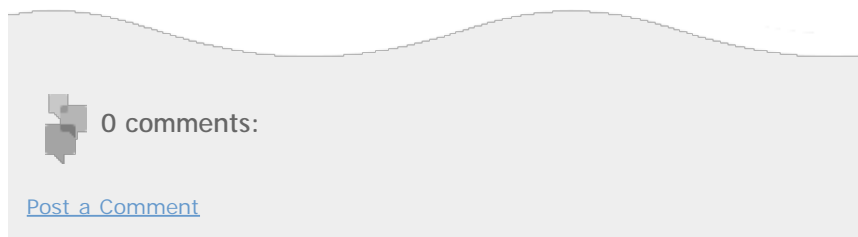
### Universal You - Your Sin City
